Call for Proposals **Deadline: Friday, February 14, 2014**

Erie County Office for the Disabled, Erie County Department of Senior Services, Niagara County Office for the Aging, The Cantalician Center, OAHIO – “The Good Path”, Independent Living of Niagara County (ILNC), Independent Living of Genesee Region, and Western New York Independent Living, Inc. invite workshop proposal submissions for our 2014 Western New York Summit on Aging and Independence. Proposals must reflect the mission of the conference to identify, examine and evaluate next practices (initiatives addressing emerging issues and trends) in research, public policy, service and culture for older Americans and people with disabilities.

The purpose of the Summit is to identify and reveal critical efforts and issues in aging, independence and culture. What is being done? Why is it being done? What will be the impact?

Guide for Proposal Preparation

About the Conference

An audience of approximately 200 people (minimum) will be participating in a two-day program that will include a keynote presentation and a series of concurrent workshops, symposia and seminars addressing present and future needs of the elderly and people with disabilities residing in the Niagara Region, Erie, Genesee and Southern Ontario.

Summit Theme: Summit on Aging, Independence and Culture in an Evolving World.

Potential Topic Opportunities:

- Trans-generational program development and delivery – strategies for developing programs that integrate age groups, disabled and non-disabled and rural and urban populations.
- Trans-generational communities and networks – strategies that establish and sustain systems for identification and innovative dissemination of resources and services.
- Trans-generational programs for inclusion – strategies for developing programs that address cultural diversity, aging and independence.
- Health Care – next practices in the diagnosis and treatment of the most prevalent diseases among the elderly and people with disabilities.
- Healthy Lifestyles – next practices in initiatives that promote healthy living and injury prevention.
- Gerontology – next practices in addressing emotional, social and psychological issues associated with aging and disability.



- Assistive Technology – next practices in development of affordable technologies that support independence for elderly and people with disabilities.
- Aging, Disabilities and Culture – How is aging and disabilities viewed by different cultures.

This list is not exhaustive. We encourage you to submit a proposal of interest to our expected attendees, who include:

- area researchers and educators from the fields of health, gerontology, rehabilitation and technology
- public policy and disability rights advocates, grass roots organizers and human rights organizations
- traditional and non-traditional long-term care and health care providers, durable medical equipment providers, medical equipment and pharmaceutical service providers and programs and services supporting aging in place.

Proposals which best address the content areas outlined above will be given priority. Proposals will be scored by the Steering Committee based on this criterion as well as clarity, objectives, method of presentation, likely interest to participants and overall program balance. Incomplete proposals will not be considered. You will be notified by **April 20, 2014** as to whether your proposal has been selected.

Submission Guidelines

Proposals should be submitted using the outline below in Microsoft Word or similar software (1 inch margins – Arial 12 font). The outline and all information must be provided. Incomplete proposals will not be considered by the committee. Please include session title and contact person's name and number each page at the top.

If possible, please submit the proposal as an email attachment (Microsoft Word or PDF) to ylucas@wnyil.org. Proposals submitted via email should use the last name of the lead presenter as the filename. 5. Session summary (50 words maximum)

This 1- 4 sentence summary will be printed in the conference program.

6. Abstract (250 words maximum)

Please be as concise as possible and clearly describe:

- Presentation topic/focus
- Learning objectives
- Outline of presentation content

7. Please provide the following additional information for the selection process

- a) Describe the purpose and nature of your proposed session. Be specific about how you will lead the session, including what topics will be covered?
- b) Why are you the best person to conduct this proposed session? Describe your history, involvement and/or experience in aging and independence and why you think you would be a qualified presenter or facilitator:
- c) Describe how your session will be interactive. How will you engage participants so that they will be active participants in the session?

8. Equipment

Please indicate the equipment you will need for your presentation. Meeting rooms are equipped with a PA system and easel. If a laptop is needed, presenters will need to bring their own. Projectors and screens can be provided if requested in advance.

9. Handouts

Please let us know if you plan to distribute printed materials. Materials may not be distributed if they are not also available in accessible formats.
